MYTH #1



YOU HAVE TO BE GOOD AT ENGLISH

- This is a business paper not an English paper
- Skillset you need to write the written events paper is completely different
- This paper is more research focused
- Most teams learn how to write the paper along the way anyway

MYTH #2



YOU HAVE TO WRITE THE MAX PAGE LENGTH

- Don't get scared by the "20 page long" paper
- 20 or 10 is the MAXIMUM length for the paper
- It is possible to still do well with a shorter paper many previous winners have shorter papers!




THE PAPER DOESN'T REALLY MATTER

- Although you don't have to write the full 20 pages, you should try to get close
- 10 page papers should fill up all the space they have available
- Focus your attention on the executive summary



ONCE YOU FINISH YOUR PROJECT, YOU'RE DONE WITH IT

- Don't stop working on your project once you get past District
- Continuously update your project with new research and additions to your plan
- Change parts of you project based on previous judges' feedback



SINCE YOU'RE ALLOWED NOTECARDS, YOU SHOULD USE ONE

- Unless you're under a time crunch to memorize your presentation, don't use notecards
- You look more prepared and professional if your presentation is completely memorized



YOU CAN WEAR ANY KIND OF PROFESSIONAL DRESS

- Match your teammates and presentation
- Color coordination makes you stand out to the judges
- You need to be as memorable as possible so the judge remembers you when they're scoring everyone
